

## Glossop Cricket Club Code of Conduct for Young People

*Glossop Cricket Club* is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all its members. Junior member are expected to abide by the following junior code of conduct and parents are asked to consider and agree that:

- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion. We do not encourage aggressive, bullying attitudes during games and expect parents to behave in a similar manner.
- Parents will let coaches know if their child is not able to play in a match or attend a coaching session and keep to agreed timings
- Members must wear suitable kit for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager.
- Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke, consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
- Parents/carers are responsible for transport to and from matches and practice sessions, provided either by themselves or by another adult approved by them. Offers of help with transport from parents via team managers are always welcome once you are sure that your car insurance allows such help
- Team photographs and videos for coaching are often taken during the season. If you do not wish your child to be part of such a photo/video please inform his/her team manager. For similar reasons we are asked to discourage parents from taking group photos of players without the permission of the club.
- Mobile phones should not be used in the changing rooms. Phones may be used in other parts of the building and outside the building.
- U13 players selected to play in a Senior match or nets must have written parental consent (given to team captain) N.B. Year 7 students and under cannot play in Senior games.
- With parental consent, emails, texts to mobile phones and social networks will be used to provide information regarding cricket arrangements
