



Code of Conduct for Young Players and Parents

Glossop Cricket Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing and enjoyment of all its members. Due to this we ask that young players and parents / carers read and are mindful of *the Young Player's and Parent's Code of Conduct*.

We expect young players to:

- have fun, encourage and support their teammates.
- play within the rules and respect all officials and their decisions.
- respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- wear suitable kit for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager.
- represent the club to the highest of possible standards. Junior members must not smoke, consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
- not use mobile phones or other devices inside of the changing room.

We expect parents/ carers to:

- support and encourage young players (of both teams) and understand that making mistakes are part of a young players learning process.
- provide transport to and from matches and practice sessions, either by themselves or by another adult approved by them.
- pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- communicate with coaches if their child is not able to play in a match or attend a coaching session and keep to agreed timings.

Under the age of 16, communication (emails, texts, whastapp messages, phone calls) should ALWAYS take place between parents and coaches, not between the individual player and coaches.
